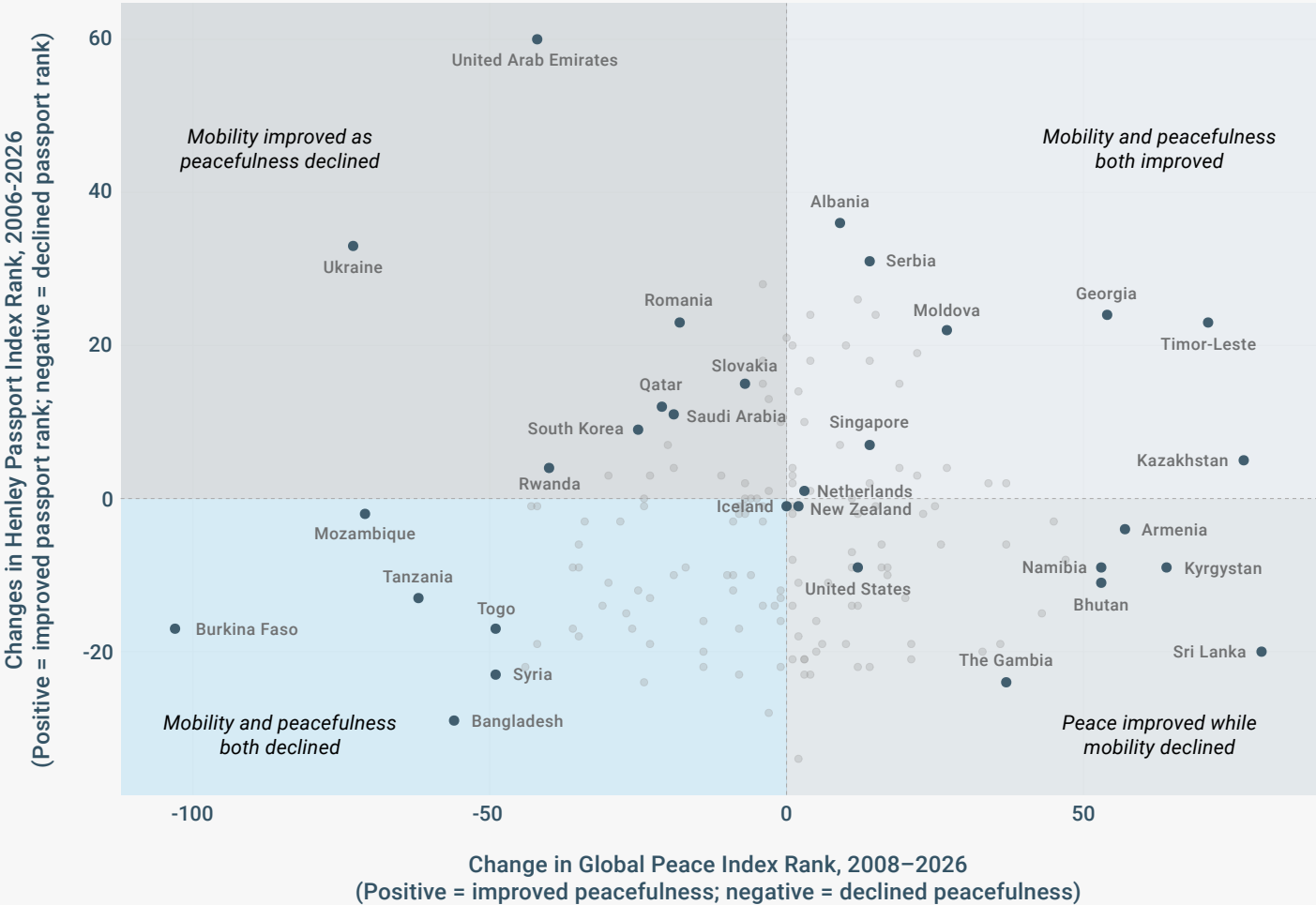


Tracking Two Decades of Peace and Passport Power

Changes in Ranking Over 20 Years

Looking at how both the Henley Passport Index ranking and the Global Peace Index ranking has changed over time

Note: Unlike the strong relationship between current HPI and GPI rankings, changes in passport power and peacefulness over the past two decades show no statistically significant correlation. These quadrants highlight where the two trajectories have diverged most clearly.
